



**Design:** Angelique den Brok

This easy stitch pattern only uses knit and purl stitches, but it gives the bulky and luscious Rasta just a little bit of structure. The pattern is reversible, so it is also very suitable for a long, loopy cowl. The finished scarf might seem short and wide at first, but due to the weight of the yarn, it will soon be longer and narrower after wearing it a few times.

**Materials:** 3 skeins of *Malabrigo Rasta*, color no. 884 "Boreal"  
Straight or circular needles size 12 mm (US 17)

**Finished size:** 30 × 160 cm

### *Directions:*

Cast on 28 sts with Malabrigo Rasta and needles size 12 mm.  
Work in pattern as follows:

**Right side rows:** K2, work the chart 4 times (read from right to left), K2  
**Wrong side rows:** K2, work the chart 4 times (read from left to right), K2

Repeat the pattern until your scarf has the desired length and bind off in pattern.

If you want to make a **scarf** simply weave in ends.

For a **cowl** you can either make a straight loop or you can make a half twist before you sew the short ends together.

Just pin the ends together with a few safety pins before sewing and see which version you prefer. Sew cast on edge to bind off edge.

Weave in ends.



**Blocking:**

Either steam block or wet block your project and leave it to dry completely.

**Legend:**

- knit on the right side, purl on the wrong side
- purl on the right side, knit on the wrong side
