

- Design:** Corinna Tengler
- Proposed yarns:** *Malabrigo Rios* at 192 meters per skein with 100 grams or any other *Worsted* yarn: 3 skeins in colorway 844, *Nimbus Gray* and 1 skein each in colorways 195, *Black* and 036, *Pearl*

- Gauge:** 18 stitches × 30 rows = 10 × 10 cm *Raindrops* stitch
18 stitches × 34 rows = 10 × 10 cm *Downpour* stitch
18 stitches × 36 rows = 10 × 10 cm *Thunderstorm* stitch
Measure after washing and blocking.
- Materials:** Circular needles 4.5 mm / US 7 and 5 mm / US 8, both 100 cm long
Alter your needle sizes to achieve gauge.
- Finished size:** Length 200 cm, 72 cm width at the widest part

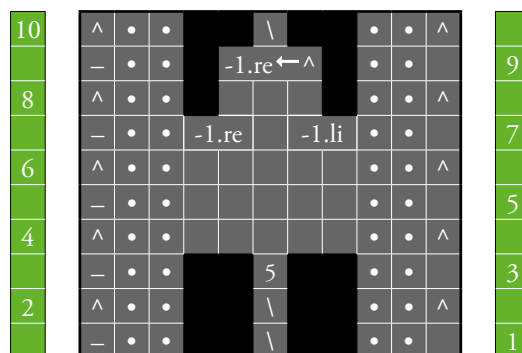

<input type="checkbox"/> + single increase –	knit front and back
<input type="checkbox"/> 3 double increase –	knit, but leave the old stitch on the left hand needle, bring yarn to front, purl that same stitch, bring yarn to back and knit that same stitch <i>Caution! Not to be confused with</i> knit front and back and front.
<input type="checkbox"/> 5 quadruple increase –	knit, but leave the old stitch on the left hand needle, bring yarn to front, purl that same stitch, bring yarn to back and knit that same stitch, bring yarn to front, purl that same stitch, bring yarn to back and knit that same stitch
<input type="checkbox"/> -1.li single decrease –	slip 2 stitches separately as if to knit and knit these two together through the back loop
<input type="checkbox"/> -1.re single decrease –	knit 2 stitches together through the front loop
<input type="checkbox"/> - single decrease –	knit 2 stitches together through the back loop
<input type="checkbox"/> ← ^ ^ double decrease –	slip 2 stitches simultaneously as if to knit, knit one stitch and pass both slipped stitches over
<input type="checkbox"/> -1.re ← ^ double decrease –	slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit two stitches together through the front loop and pass slipped stitch over

Now you will add a *Drop-Lace-Border* across the live stitches of the shawl. Using color 2, cast on 7 new stitches to the right of the first stitch. The Cable cast-on is perfectly suitable for this.

Now follow and repeat the *Drop-Lace* chart from row 1 to 10 all across the edge.

Drop-Lace-Border chart



Depending on your previous stitch count, you might need to cheat a little bit towards the end ...

190 stitches: no alterations needed

198 stitches: pick up an additional stitch from the edge in both of the last two repeats of row 9 and knit the last stitch in color 2 together with the additional stitch (through the back loop)

206 stitches: at the end of the last repeat of row 9, knit 3 stitches (not 2) together through the back loop

214 stitches: in the last repeat of row 9, pick up an additional stitch from the edge and knit the last stitch in color 2 together with the additional stitch (through the back loop)

Bind off all remaining stitches as they appear. Weave in loose ends and thoroughly wet block your shawl.
